


MONTHLY SAFETY TIP - Restraints – Although you and your dog dislike putting on a leash, remember that without proper restraints, accidents can happen quickly. If your dog isn't familiar with going for a walk on a leash, start with short walks around the yard. Refrain from going long distances until your dog feels comfortable following commands. On this same note, make sure the leash you put on the dog is appropriate for his size, breed and weight.

RECIPES

Peanut Butter

Ingredients:
 2 tbsp cooking oil (unsweetened applesauce can be used)
 ½ cup creamy peanut butter
 1 cup filtered water
 3 cups flour



Dog Treats

Instructions: Mix all the ingredients together in a bowl using your hands because it's pretty thick. Grease a cookie sheet (olive oil is good!) and smush the dough onto the sheet. Cut dough into desired shapes before baking. Cookie cutters or knife both work! Bake for 20 minutes at 350°, cool, break apart and serve! Treats may be placed in the freezer so they stay fresh longer.

Healthy Dog Cookies

Ingredients:
 1 cup all purpose flour
 1 cup whole wheat flour
 4 eggs
 1/2 cup butter
 1/2 cup peanut oil (or olive oil)
 1/2 cup green yogurt
 1/2 cup brown sugar

Instructions: Using a wooden spoon combine all ingredients in a large mixing bowl except yogurt and 2 tbsp water. Turn dough out onto a floured work surface. Roll out until about 1/2" thick. Use a biscuit cutter to cut out rounds and place onto a baking sheet lined with parchment paper. Use fingertips to create pawprint mold on each biscuit, making sure each mold is deep and distinct. Bake in a 400 degree oven for 20-25 minutes. until biscuits are golden and crispy. Remove and let cool. In a small mixing bowl combine yogurt and water and stir into the hot yogurt. Use a spoon to apply yogurt into each pawprint mold. Place in an airtight container in the fridge and keep up to a week.

When your Pet goes missing...

We know that one of the most stressful things a family sometimes faces is when their beloved animal companion suddenly disappears. It is hard to think clearly at such a time so we hope this checklist will help you return your pet time quickly.

- Contact your neighbors immediately and ask them to keep watch in the neighborhood.
- Check with your local police department ask if your community has a dog pound.
- Check with the county Sheriff. Ask them to watch for your pet as they drove around the area. If you live near the county line, you may have to contact more than one Sheriff's Department.
- Contact the veterinarians in your vicinity. Found animals are often brought to them.
- Contact your local newspaper and place a "Lost Pet Ad."
- Contact your local radio and cable station. Ask them to make a public service announcement in your pet's behalf.
- Contact the bus company so that drivers can watch for your pet.
- Contact your local pet store or animal food supplier. Animals often turn up there or they hear about wandering animals
- Check Petfinder.com, in case someone has found your pet and posted a listing on the website.
- And very important, check with your local HUMANE SOCIETY.

And make sure you contact us: **Your Group | Website | Email | Phone**

We can help you print posters to circulate if you provide us with a photo of your animal. We will be happy to check our recent found animals and alert our membership to be on the watch for your pet.

Of course, planning ahead is always the best way to prevent permanent loss.

- Having your pet micro chipped is a very good way to insure his or her return.
- Also make sure your pet wears a collar with name and address tag
- PLEASE spay or neuter your pet. They more likely remain "homebodies."
